The Stitzel/Temple Finding Peaceful Paths award supports WVU Center for Women's and Gender Studies majors, WGST and LGBTQ Studies minors, and WGST graduate certificate programs students' progress beyond the classroom in their efforts to explore, develop and apply feminist perspectives and non-violent solutions to personal, institutional and environmental challenges and conflicts. When funds and circumstances permit, students may work with a faculty mentor, or as a member of a university club to undertake their project.

Eligibility Criteria

- Eberly College of Arts and Sciences students, either undergraduate or graduate, who are
 majoring or minoring in undergraduate or graduate programs offered by the Center for
 Women's and Gender Studies or the Leadership Studies Program
- To be eligible and to receive funding, the student must be currently enrolled at WVU at the time when the award funds are used to support the students' activities.
- Areas of activity beyond the classroom applicable to this award include but are not limited to:
 - $\circ \;\;$ conference travel and participation
 - o archive research (such as those at the Peace Archive at Swarthmore College)
 - o creation of educational, artistic and dramatic programs
 - o conducting oral histories
 - o conducting other forms of research to advance social/environmental justice goals at the local, regional, national, and/or global level

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Application Requirements:

- One-page description of how their project is likely to fulfill the Stitzel/Temple Award goals as
 described above.
- A brief summary of anticipated expenses.
- A brief summary of the expected timeline for the activity or activities and expected outcome.
- If a faculty mentor is involved, the applicant will briefly highlight the importance of the faculty-student relationship in nourishing future generations in an increasingly complex world.
- The selected recipient(s) will provide a brief summary report to the Director of the Center for Women's and Gender Studies and to the donors within six months of completion of the project.
