engineering and math, as well as feminist approaches to research. With which topics are you

Typically one of the GTAs will teach or assist in teaching the large-enrollment undergraduate course WGST 150: Women in Movies, while most other GTAs will teach WGST 170: Introduction to Women's and Gender Studies. Responsibilities include using online teaching tools and independently grading students' work for courses. If you have particular interest in one or the other of these courses, please list your experience(s) in this area or why you would be interested.

Women's and gender studies is an interdisciplinary field. GTAs will be expected to cover material outside of their expertise. Briefly explain how you might approach teaching outside your
